It’s a full house at Winter Nights these days. Finally. We have welcomed 4 families into the shelter and are at our maximum socially-distanced capacity, 5 parents, and 7 of their children. Ages 2 – 18 years old.

Volunteers continue to deliver meals purchased from commercial kitchens. The staff is amazing, picking up all the roles that volunteers did inside the shelter in the past. They are warming meals, setting them out on a separate table for each family, taking care of cleanup, helping with activities for children and teens, sanitizing, doing laundry, taking temperatures and charting.

We don't think that this week's lifting of stay-at-home orders in California will impact the shelter-in-place protocols we are operating under. We are waiting for more information from the County.

We are grateful to report that 7 of 8 managers and staff have been vaccinated for Covid-19.

Welcome to Winter Nights, Covid-style.

Bill Shaw, Program Director, says that in his 7 years as a Winter Nights manager he has never spent so much time interviewing, explaining, and screening homeless families for a good fit, only to have them not show up. But we seem to be turning the corner and families have filled the Shelter. But not without special care.

He described a situation where a family with 2 toddlers was ready to enter the Shelter, so they needed to be tested for Covid-19. The county now has a program in Richmond for the homeless to get tested and stay in a hotel while waiting for their results. The family was tested and three days later, on Friday, the tests were negative. (Yay!) The county arranged for an Uber driver to bring them to the Winter Nights shelter in Pleasant Hill. When the Uber arrived at the hotel, there was a problem: No car seats for the little ones. The County contacted Kathleen Garcia, WN Shelter Manager and said the family would have to wait until Monday so the county could get car seats for the Uber ride.

Kathleen thought: maybe there is another way? Could we use our van, with car seats, to get them? No, the van was in use taking other families to shower at Oasis. But then she and Bill thought of something. They called the office and asked Teri to take her own car to Pittsburg, grab two car seats from storage, and head to Richmond. Teri did, the car seats were successfully installed in the Uber and the family arrived safely in Pleasant Hill, on Friday, as planned.

Just doing what we do, Covid-style.



Not every shelter site has showers, and that was the case in January. On weekdays, clients were showering at our Oasis Day Center. The Winter Nights van was very busy. With only one family at a time allowed in the van, it means multiple trips to Oasis, and cleaning the van in between.

On Sundays, The Bay Church of Concord is volunteering its Clean Start mobile showers at shelter sites without showers. This is a mighty mission of The Bay Church and we appreciate their support. The families are delighted, too.



Safe Parking Program

Almost Ready to Go

Plans for opening the Safe Parking Program were delayed a bit, but we think we we have it together now. It will be opening

February 1st. The Church of the Nazarene in Pittsburg has invited us to use their facility and we will be able to serve 6-7 cars in their lot. It is not a drop-in program, so all guests will be screened, interviewed and Covid-tested. We look forward to helping families and individuals living in their cars with supervised overnight parking (8 pm – 6 am), breakfast items, showers at Oasis, and access to all of our client services if they choose.

We have hired Donna, a former staff member to lead the charge as our SPP Project Manager and a site supervisor who is a former Shelter client. One more hire to go.
