The Safe Parking Program

The Safe Parking Program is now a Year-Round

program! It is also operating at full capacity with a large wait list. There are 9 cars with 10 participants, and a waitlist of over 14 cars.

We are so excited to be able to provide this program in Pittsburg at the Church of the Nazarene. It is really changing lives for so many individuals, couples and families living in their vehicles. The Church threw a wonderful dinner for the SPP participants and staff early in September. It was fun for everyone, and great way to just relax and enjoy each other's company. Thank You. One of the families in the program, a father with two daughters, had been parking on the street in front of the church for several nights in late August. Donna, the SPP manager, went out and talked to the dad and brought them into the program immediately . As Bill said, "it's who we are and what we do".

This family, and one other (a mother and father with a 6-year-old and a 6-month-old) moved into the shelter this week.
