

The Walnut Creek Presbyterian Church is celebrating Martin Luther King on **February 26th** with a Gospel Choir Concert and a presentation by Dr. Melba Pattillo Beals, a member of the Little Rock Nine.

"Dr. Melba Pattillo Beals made history as a member of the Little Rock Nine, the nine African-American students involved in the desegregation of Little Rock Central High School in 1957. The world watched as they braved constant intimidation and threats from those who opposed desegregation of the formerly all-white high school. She later recounted this harrowing year in her book titled Warriors Don't Cry: A Searing Memoir of the Battle to Desegregate Little Rock's Central High School."
