MORE Help ▲ Families Home

Our **2024 Annual Appeal** started November 1st with a goal to raise **\$200,000** by December 31st. Thank you to those who have already donated.

To date \$92,800 has been raised 47% of our \$200,000 goal





If you are among those who have made a donation to the Appeal, thank you.

If you haven't, and can help us raise the remaining \$105,700 we would be so grateful.

Since the start of our year in July we have helped a total of 105 people in our programs: 27 at the Family Shelter, 32 at Safe Parking-Antioch, 34 at Safe Parking-Pittsburg. We distributed 15 Thanksgiving food boxes to alumni households and we are now planning Christmas food boxes and gifts.

Continued Success





Sixteen Continued Success families signed up for Thanksgiving food boxes this year. We received donations of 9 boxes with gift cards. One donor group brought an extra 4 gift cards. Anita Weil, from Temple Isaiah, brought extra food, donated to a different project she worked on. We had to purchase only a small number of items to fill the gaps and make up the additional boxes to provide a special meal to 52 alumni in 15 families.



Quilts to Share delivered quilts, pillow cases, tote bags and holiday place mats (as well as ones for everyday use). One of our partners shared a large quantity of socks with us that they had received. We'd also received Lady Bug Bags (feminine hygiene products) to distribute.



We were able to share all of these items with our Continued Success clients and they were thrilled with all of the goodies they received. They are also excited and grateful to be able to come back in December for Christmas food boxes donated by the Knights of Columbus.


